Just last November, investment banking firm Bear Stearns announced that games as a category would grow significantly faster than television, radio, movies, music and newspapers, and they seem to be on to something: Americans' spending on video games reached an incredible \$4.6 billion last year, which is more than the total amount spent on movies (rental and theater combined). Today's games are a far cry from the classic Atar of the 1970s, which created most modern-day game guri.
